Form and use simple verb tenses. Ensure subject-verb and pronoun-antecedent agreement. Form and use comparative and superlative adjectives and adverbs correctly. Use coordinating and subordinating conjunctions. Produce simple, compound, and complex sentences. Capitalize appropriate words in titles. Use commas in addresses. Use commas and quotation marks in dialogue. Form and use possessives. Determine the meaning of a new word formed when a known affix is added to a known word. Use a known root word as a clue to the meaning of an unknown word with the same root. Identify real-life connections between words and their use. Group related information together, including illustrations when needed to provide clarity to the reader. Develop the topic with facts, definitions, and details. Provide a conclusion. Use linking words and phrases to connect ideas within categories of information. Use precise language to inform about or explain the topic. Apply language standards addressed in the Foundational Literacy standards. <p>3.W.TTP.3 Write narratives to develop real or imagined experiences or events using an effective technique, such as descriptive details and clear event sequences.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Establish a situation by using a narrator, including characters, and organizing an event sequence that unfolds naturally. Use dialogue and/or descriptions of actions, thoughts, and feelings to develop experiences and events, or to show the response of characters to situations. Use temporal words and phrases to signal event order. Provide a sense of closure.
